

During our summer vacationing we came across various rocks and precious stones. This book was a great follow up for me and my kids. It is beautifully illustrated and insightful. It also pairs nicely with the study of ancient civilization as it touches on petroglyphs, mortar and pestal usage and shows a large beautiful drawing of Lapis Lazuli which the Ishtar Gate of the ancient city of Babylon was made out of. This book paired nicely with an early reader book by National Geographic Kids entitled, "Rocks and Minerals". I will definitely be checking out other books by this author and illustrator,

Aston and Long.

Let's be honest here. Teaching the rock cycle to kids can sometimes be a little boring and dry, but throw this book into the mix and it's fun and exciting! I LOVE all her books and illustrations- they bring even mundane ordinary things to life and make them appealing. A must for any teacher's library!

Beautiful illustrations and poetic, surprising text combine to make a terrific nonfiction picture book. If you thought rocks just sat there, think again. This book will make you look at rocks in an entirely different way. Excerpt: "...bubbling like a pot of soup deep beneath the earth's crust...liquid...molten...boiling" The poetic text alternates with straight prose: "Depending on what type of rock it is, a rock melts at temperatures between 1,300 and 2,400 degrees Fahrenheit (700 and 1,300 degrees Celsius)." A wonderful book for your little (or big) rock collector!

I got this book for my granddaughter (age 7) since she's into rocks (go figure). The graphics are beautiful but the book is a little skimpy for my liking. Nevertheless, a very nice book for a future rock hound.

Lovely balance between art and science. Beautiful illustrations coupled with lyrical text and solid information. The entire series by this author/illustrator duo is wonderful. I would think especially appealing to girls.
