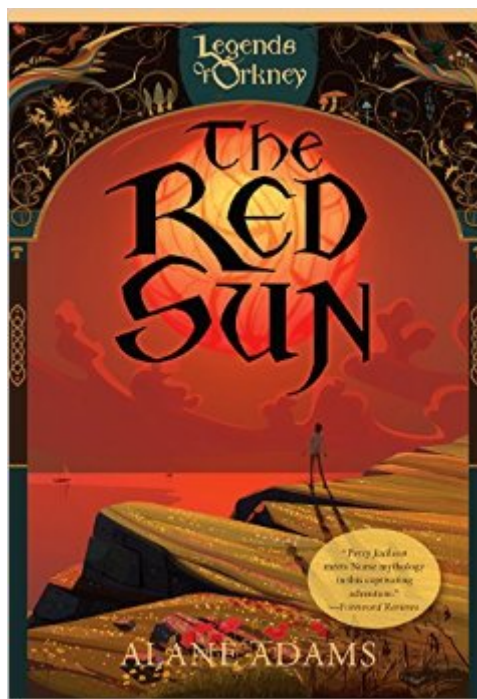


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The Red Sun (Legends Of Orkney)

I found this book very enjoyable read. I can see how YA would love the fantasy of this story (it is a
